Regulations: PLEASE READ!

NLIS scanning will commence on Saturday morning prior to judging. Ensure all forms are completed and available for the NLIS operator.

1. All EXHIBITORS NEED TO SUPPLY THEIR OWN BEDDING STRAW.
2. Age of Cattle shall be as at to 1st July 2017.
3. All animals will be registered in a Herd Book of the respective Breed Society.
4. All Animals are to be owned by the EXHIBITOR for 3 Months PRIOR to the Show.
5. **Registration certificate(s) must be made available to Stewards if requested.**
6. All exhibitors MUST have Public Liability Insurance and to have same endorsed for travelling to Gatton Show.
7. **Each Entry must be accompanied by a Certificate of Health Declaration**
8. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure the leaders of their stock in judging rings and Grand Parade are capable of exercising control over the animals in their care, to ensure public safety and safety of other exhibitors.
9. Any Animal shown as an individual Exhibit may not be shown with its Dam.
10. In Cow classes, calves exhibited at foot MUST be UNDER 8 Months of Age.
11. The Exhibits will only be accepted from Brucellosis and Tuberculosis clean heard (status monitored negative, tested negative or confirmed free) recognised by the D.P.I.
12. **JOHNE'S DISEASE** – Cattle must not be introduced unless they comply with the conditions for animals to enter Queensland:
 - a) They are from a non restricted herd in a Johne's Disease protected or free zone OR
 - b) They are from a check tested Negatived or MN1 (Monitored Negative) or better herd in a Control or Residual Zone.

13. Any Exhibitors intending to bring Electrical Equipment to the Showgrounds are required to ensure it is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected & tagged by a licensed electrical contractor. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the public; and is a requirement of the Workplace Health & Safety Act 1889. The Act imposes severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed entry to Showgrounds.
14. **ALL CATTLE HOUSED OVERNIGHT MUST HAVE NECK STRAP**
15. **All Animals over 4 Months must have Nose Grip or Ring. Bulls 1 year and over must have NOSE RING.**
16. All Exhibits **MUST** be haltered at all times.
16. **All Stock MUST be FREE from Ticks.** Tick infested cattle will not be allowed to compete and must be removed from the Showgrounds.

Spraying Facilities are available at the Showgrounds with No charge to Exhibitors from Cattle Tick Free Areas. Exxhibitors must provide a copy of their **completed Waybill/NVD.**

Beef Cattle Paraders Competition Rules

To be eligible for the State Finals, Competitors must comply with ALL Rules noted below. Paraders' competitions are to determine the Parader who presents and parades an animal before a judge most effectively.

- 1) Paraders will parade their animal in a clockwise manner as is normal in a cattle judging ring at the discretion of the Judge.
- 2) Competitors must be over 15 and under 25 years of age on the 1st May in the year of the State Final
- 3) Competitors under 17 years of age must have approval of a parent or guardian to compete.
- 4) Competitors are to be a Queensland resident for three (3) months prior to competing, or be attending an educational institution in Queensland unless they qualify under rule five (5) below.
- 5) Competitors residing interstate who can provide an affinity with a Queensland Show are allowed entry provided they satisfy one (1) of the following criteria:
 - a) Their address has a Queensland postcode;
 - b) They have a Queensland phone number;
 - c) The competitor or their parents are active working members of that show.
- 6) National winners are ineligible to compete.

Procedure for local show level competition:

- 7) An entry form must be completed for all competitors
- 8) Different age classes may be added to program for judging.
- 9) Paraders must wear a white dust coat and not display any name or logo at the Stewards discretion.
- 10) Beef Cattle Paraders may lead a steer or heifer; or a Bull under 20 months.
- 11) For safety reasons, Judges are not permitted to ask competitors in Young Parader Competitions to swap animals.
- 12) Cattle are to be presented in their natural, clean state – No glitter is permissible on animal or Parader.

Tick Spraying Facilities Available Free of Charge to Exhibitors from Cattle Tick Free Areas

All exhibitors must have a **COMPLETED** Waybill

Any Exhibitor who does not meet the above requirements are required to have spraying completed at an alternative dip area and will be charged normal inspection fees

NATIONAL CATTLE HEALTH DECLARATION EXPLANATORY NOTES

OVERVIEW

The Cattle Health Declaration is a legal document. Please complete accurately before signing.

Cattle Health Declarations are a way for producers to provide information about the health status of the cattle they are selling. Buyers should ask vendors for a Declaration and use the information provided to determine the health risks associated with the animals offered for sale.

Some states require testing or certification additional to that outlined in this document, e.g. Johne's disease (JD) in WA. Please check the entry requirements for any interstate movements at:

www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/livestock-movements/

The original is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

QUESTION 3: PESTIVIRUS TESTING

Persistently infected animals can be detected by conducting a pestivirus antigen test. This test only needs to be conducted once in an animal's life. Cattle that test positive in most cases are persistently infected animals. Pestivirus antibody testing may be done to check the pestivirus status of the herd. Contact your veterinarian for assistance in understanding the test results.

QUESTIONS 4 & 5 – ENZOOTIC BOVINE LEUCOSIS (EBL)

All cattle entering Tasmania must meet at least **ONE** of the following criteria:

- Cattle have been tested for EBL with the ELISA test within 42 days before shipment with negative results and evidence supplied via an attached laboratory report. If samples were pooled, no more than 10 sera or 30 milk samples were combined in each pool. Unweaned calves less than 12-weeks-of-age transported with their dam do not require testing for EBL; *OR*
- Dairy cattle from a registered dairy herd must be accredited as Monitored Negative (MN) or better, according to the national guidelines for EBL Control; *OR*
- Beef or beef-cross breeds must come from herds in Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia (*excluding the cattle tick infected area*), New South Wales (*excluding the former North Coast Livestock Health and Pest Authority District*), or Queensland (*excluding the cattle tick infested area*). The herd of origin must have been in existence for at least three (3) years with no evidence of EBL infection in the last three (3) years.

QUESTIONS 6, 7 & 8: JOHNE'S DISEASE BEEF CATTLE

Note: JD is a notifiable disease, so it is important to answer these questions.

Occurrence of JD refers to clinical disease in the herd or on the property. Clinical disease is an infected animal with chronic diarrhoea and weight-loss that does not respond to treatment.

The **Johne's Beef Assurance Score (J-BAS)** is a tool developed for JD risk profiling. Details are available on the Animal Health Australia website under 'JD in cattle'. The J-BAS is an initial guide and purchasers should ask for more information about JD in the origin herd (see JD in Cattle Biosecurity Checklist on the AHA website under 'JD in cattle'). Transitional arrangements are in place until 30 June 2017. The *National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual - Grazing Livestock Production* provides a template to use for the property biosecurity plan. All plans should include the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Plan Checklist.

Check test – testing of 50 adult animals in the herd (or all eligible animals in a herd if less than 50 adult animals) biased to increase the probability of detecting infection, tested by ELISA, (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR.

Sample test - screening of the adult herd or a large representative sample of the adult herd by an approved test (ELISA, (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR).

QUESTION 9: JOHNE'S DISEASE DAIRY CATTLE

JD herd status information about Dairy Assurance Score calculation is available at www.dairyaustralia.com.au/bjd

QUESTION 10 & 11: TREATMENTS & VACCINATIONS

Provide details on any cattle treatments and vaccinations within the last six (6) months.

Some manufacturers include more than one of the categories listed in the same vaccine, known as a combination vaccine. If you use a combination vaccine, each agent(s), as appropriate, should be detailed.

For vaccinations to be current, you must have followed the manufacturer's recommendation for vaccination. Typically, young animals or first time vaccinated animals need two (2) doses, followed by annual boosters. As variations to this general rule do occur (e.g. Silirum is given once only), you must use the manufacturer's recommendations.

At the date the declaration is made, the animals must be considered protected from the diseases listed.
