### **PRIVACY STATEMENT**

You can be assured that the privacy of your personal information is of the utmost importance to us. The information provided by you in any application for membership or application to enter is used by the Gatton Show Society (GSS) to offer member services or to organise and conduct competitions at the Gatton Show. By entering such competitions, you consent to provide such details as your name, address, and exhibit details. Competition information may be made available to the media and included in GSS publications. Your information will not be disclosed without your consent for any other purpose unless required by the law. You may request access to your information and request that our records of that information be corrected by contacting our Chief Steward or by writing to the GSS

### **WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY**

The Gatton Showgrounds are a designated Workplace within the meaning of the Workplace Health and Safety Act 2011 and exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control, including their contractors or sub-contractors, comply with all requirements of the Act and the GSS holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the Gatton Showgrounds.

Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, GSS staff, show visitors, children and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.

Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors.

Exhibits will only be led and handled by competent persons whose experience is known to the exhibitor/competitor. A "No Smoking Policy" will be strictly adhered to and policed by exhibitors/competitors and exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of Primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or any naked light, is prohibited in the pavilions. Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools, and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited, and all power boards must also be tested and tagged.

All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect. The Gatton Showgrounds is subject to a Special Facility License issued under the Liquor Act 1992 and strict laws related to the consumption and possession of liquor across the Gatton Showgrounds site. The consumption or possession of liquor outside of the licensed bar areas is not authorised by the Gatton Show Society and in many cases may be an offence for which on the spot fines can be issued by Police and Liquor Licensing Investigators. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors/competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Gatton Show.

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the following extracts from the GSS By-Laws.

### **VETERINARY TREATMENT & INSPECTION**

No pharmaceutical shall be administered to any animal exhibit except under the direction of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon who shall advise the Section Stewards if such pharmaceutical is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize and in such case the Section Stewards may debar the animal from competing. Section Steward may at any time direct the Society's Veterinary Surgeons to take a sample of blood, saliva, or urine from an exhibit for testing.

### **DISEASE OR DANGER**

Should there be any reason to suspect that any Exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, or objectionable, the Society through its Officials, reserves the rights of removing the same from or refusing its admittance to the Gatton Show.

An Exhibitor who detects or suspects any illness amongst any of his entries whilst the animals are at the Showgrounds must:

- (a) Report this fact immediately to the Chief Steward responsible for that section.  
Ensure that the animal/s is/are contained within its/their accommodation area/s unless advised otherwise by the Chief Steward or the Society's Veterinary Surgeon
- (b) Where feasible to do so, contain soiled bedding from the animal/s within its/their accommodation area.

The Society may at its discretion require to have any biological tests conducted on any animal exhibited at the Gatton Show or to have materials collected from such animals in order to have tests carried out, after such animals arrive at the Showgrounds.

If in the opinion of the Chief Steward of a Section, an Exhibit requires Veterinary treatment and the Exhibitor cannot be contacted immediately, the Chief Steward may instruct a Veterinary Surgeon to treat exhibit and the costs paid by the Exhibitor to the Society. The Society shall not be in any way liable to an Exhibitor for any damage to or injury to such Exhibit.

Where, in the opinion of the Society, an Exhibit, being an animal, should be destroyed or removed from the Showgrounds, the Society's Veterinary Surgeon or the GSS may destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds, or both. Alternatively, the GSS may require the Exhibitor to destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds, or both. Any costs incurred by the Society pursuant to this By-Law must be reimbursed by the Exhibitor.

The Society shall not be responsible for any loss or damage caused (inter alia) through disease or infection howsoever arising.

## **BIOSECURITY QUEENSLAND REGULATIONS**

All Queenslanders have a 'general biosecurity obligation' (GBO) under Queensland's Biosecurity Act 2014 (PDF, 1.5MB). Not complying with the GBO is an offence.

This means that everyone is responsible for managing biosecurity risks that are:

- under their control and
- that they know about or should be expected to know about.

Under the GBO, individuals and organisations whose activities pose a biosecurity risk must:

- take all reasonable and practical steps to prevent or minimise each biosecurity risk
- minimise the likelihood of causing a 'biosecurity event,' and limit the consequences if such an event is caused the following conditions will apply to stock and Vehicles moving on to the Gatton Showgrounds

## **STOCK GENERAL:**

### **EXHIBITORS REQUIRE THE FOLLOWING:**

- **National Vendor Declaration (Cattle) and Waybill, or Movement Record Document**
- **National Health Declaration Form** – version 01/07/2020 NSW Livestock owners can travel direct to the Gatton showgrounds and check their paperwork in with QDAFF staff or GSS appointed staff on entry. QDAFF staff will then inform NSW livestock owner, in writing, that they **MUST** contact Kirra Yards on 07 55364714 and inform them of their return journey 24 hours prior to leaving the Gatton showgrounds.

## **CATTLE TICK CONTROL**

Exhibitors have a general biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable and practical steps to prevent or minimise the spread of cattle tick.

A biosecurity certificate, issued by an accredited certifier, will be required to accompany cattle movement across the cattle tick line, moving from the showground in the cattle tick infested zone onto a property in the CATTLE TICK FREE ZONE.

To facilitate movement of cattle to and from the grounds all Cattle must be treated as required.

The GSS will employ an accredited officer for cattle tick inspection as stated in the above Cattle tick control.

## **JOHNE'S DISEASE – for Bovine Johne's Disease**

It is your General Biosecurity Obligation as the exhibitor NOT to knowingly spread the disease. Any Cattle from suspected herds that have not yet been cleared by Biosecurity Queensland will not be accepted on to the showgrounds.

Rules:

1. Each exhibitor has an obligation to take all reasonable and practical measures to prevent the introduction into, and spread of Johne's disease within, Queensland.
2. Exhibitors must not enter animal(s) which are known or suspected of being infected with Johne's disease, including animals which have been introduced with a significant likelihood of being infected.
3. Exhibitors must supply a health statement/declaration that provides information about the health of the animal including Johne's risk. The health statement/declaration must not be false, incomplete, or misleading. All cattle intended for slaughter must be accompanied by a fully completed National Vendor Declaration (Cattle) and Waybill.

**DISCLAIMER:** While the conditions of entry regarding disease are correct at the time of publication it is the responsibility of the owner that all conditions current at the time of entry are met.

## FODDER AND BEDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS

### Fire Ant Requirements

1. For hay grown outside the Fire Ant Area- moving to the Gatton Showgrounds
  - No restrictions
2. For Hay grown within the Fire Ant Risk Area - moving to the Gatton Showgrounds.
  - Exhibitors purchasing hay from hay producers within the Fire ant Restricted Area need to ensure that the producer is on an Approved Risk Management Plan (ARMP) for Fire ants and is complying with their agreed risk mitigation factors, which include.
  - Freshly made hay where the hay has been raked at least twice within 24 hours of baling. The hay is baled within 24 hours of the last turn and
  - If the baled hay is removed from the paddock within 24 hours of baling, it may move to any destination within Queensland with no further requirements.
3. Stored Hay – The stored hay should have been made in accord with the above requirements, prior to storage
  - Hay stored within the Fire ant Restricted Area must be stored off the ground or on an approved hard stand. or
  - The surrounding area to 30 metres from where hay has been stored on ground has been treated with a product registered for red imported fire ants 4 days prior to the movement.Or  
The hay has been lured and the lures have been submitted to Biosecurity Queensland Control Centre and found to be free of Fire ants. Visual surveillance for the presence of Fire ants has been conducted on the surrounding area and found to be visually free of the pest.
4. Hay returning home from the Gatton Showgrounds
  - Gatton is located outside the Fire ant restricted area, therefore there is no restrictions on hay being moved within Queensland.
  - Hay returning to Interstate destinations - please contact relevant Government Authority within the State in question to ensure their requirements are met. Cattle Tick Zone Hay, Chaff, Silage and Green Fodder may only be introduced if: Led Steer/Stud Beef Fodder & Bedding Requirements. Must be fit for purpose as per the Queensland Biosecurity recommendations.

### NLIS SCANNING WILL COMMENCE ON SATURDAY MORNING PRIOR TO JUDGING. ENSURE ALL FORMS ARE COMPLETED AND AVAILABLE FOR THE NLIS OPERATOR.

1. **ALL EXHIBITORS NEED TO SUPPLY THEIR OWN BEDDING STRAW.**
2. Age of Cattle shall be as at to 1<sup>st</sup> July 2023.
3. All animals will be registered in a Herd Book of the respective Breed Society.
4. All Animals are to be owned by the **EXHIBITOR** for 3 Months PRIOR to the Show.
5. Registration certificate(s) must be made available to Stewards if requested.
6. All exhibitors **MUST** have Public Liability Insurance and to have same endorsed for travelling to Gatton Show.
7. A Certificate of Health Declaration must accompany each Entry
8. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure the leaders of their stock in judging rings and Grand Parade are capable of exercising control over the animals in their care, to ensure public safety and safety of other exhibitors.
9. Any Animal shown as an individual Exhibit may not be shown with its Dam.
10. In Cow classes, calves exhibited at foot **MUST** be **UNDER** 8 Months of Age.
11. The Exhibits will only be accepted from Brucellosis and Tuberculosis clean heard (status monitored negative, assessed negative or confirmed free) recognised by the **D.P.I. ALL CATTLE HOUSED OVERNIGHT MUST HAVE NECK STRAP**
12. All Animals over 4 Months must have Nose Grip or Ring. Bulls 1 year and over must have **NOSE RING**.
13. All Exhibits **MUST** always be haltered.
14. All Stock **MUST** be **FREE** from Ticks. Tick infested cattle will not be allowed to compete and must be removed from the Showgrounds.
15. **ALL EXHIBITORS MUST SUPPLY THEIR OWN WATER TROUGH/BUCKET, NO SHARING WATER SOURCE BETWEEN EXIBITORS. Water taps are provided inside and outside of shed for filling individual water sources.**

Prior to leaving the Show Grounds, Exhibitors are asked to rake back bedding ONE METER away from wall, to aid towards clean up.

## **BEDDING**

Please be advised Gatton Show DOES NOT provide any bedding for Stud Cattle.

The Beef Cattle Chief Steward reserves the right to reallocate space to any exhibitor upon the arrival of their exhibits on the grounds if the numbers indicated by them do not arrive. Accommodation on grounds for exhibitors will only be available from the Morning of Friday 21st July 2023 as all livestock pavilions will be inaccessible prior with Dairy cattle load out and bedding being cleaned out and replaced.

Gate 5 located at the corner of Yates St and Woodlands Rd and is the only entrance available and will be open continuously until 9pm on Friday 21st of July 2023 and again on Saturday 22nd of July 2023 from 6am.

Entry and exit of stud cattle will be via Gate 5 (five).
