PRIVACY STATEMENT

You can be assured that the privacy of your personal information is of the utmost importance to us. The information provided by you in any application for membership or application to enter is used by the Gatton Show Society (GSS) to offer member services or to organise and conduct competitions at the Gatton Show. By entering such competitions, you consent to provide such details as your name, address, and exhibit details. Competition information may be made available to the media and included in GSS publications. Your information will not be disclosed without your consent for any other purpose unless required by the law. You may request access to your information and request that our records of that information be corrected by contacting our Chief Steward or by writing to the Gatton show Society.

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

The Gatton Showgrounds are a designated Workplace within the meaning of the Workplace Health and Safety Act 2011 and exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control, including their contractors or sub-contractors, comply with all requirements of the Act and the GSS holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the Gatton Showgrounds.

Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, GSS staff, show visitors, children and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.

Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors.

Exhibits will only be led and handled by competent persons whose experience is known to the exhibitor/competitor. A "No Smoking Policy" will be strictly adhered to and policed by exhibitors/competitors and exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of Primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or any naked light, is prohibited in the pavilions. Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools, and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited, and all power boards must also be tested and tagged.

All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect. The Gatton Showgrounds is subject to a Special Facility License issued under the Liquor Act 1992 and strict laws related to the consumption and possession of liquor across the Gatton Showgrounds site. The consumption or possession of liquor outside of the licensed bar areas is not authorised by the Gatton Show Society and, in many cases, may be an offence for which on the spot fines can be issued by Police and Liquor Licensing Investigators. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors/competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Gatton Show.

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the following extracts from the GSS By-Laws.

VETERINARY TREATMENT & INSPECTION

No pharmaceutical shall be administered to any animal exhibit except under the direction of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon who shall advise the Section Stewards if such pharmaceutical is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its changes of being awarded a prize and in such case the Section Stewards may debar the animal from competing. Section Steward may at any time direct the Society's Veterinary Surgeons to take a sample of blood, saliva, or urine from an exhibit for testing.

DISEASE OR DANGER

Should there be any reason to suspect that any Exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, or objectionable, the Society through its Officials, reserves the rights of removing the same from or refusing its admittance to the Gatton Show.

- An Exhibitor who detects or suspects any illness amongst any of his entries whilst the animals are at the Showgrounds must: (a) Report this fact immediately to the Chief Steward responsible for that section.
 - Ensure that the animal/s is/are contained within its/their accommodation area/s unless advised otherwise by the Chief Steward or the Society's Veterinary Surgeon
- (b) Where feasible to do so, contain soiled bedding from the animal/s within its/their accommodation area. The Society may at its discretion require to have any biological tests conducted on any animal exhibited at the Gatton Show or to have materials collected from such animals in order to have tests carried out, after such animals arrive at the Showgrounds.

If in the opinion of the Chief Steward of a Section, an Exhibit requires Veterinary treatment and the Exhibitor cannot be contacted immediately, the Chief Steward may instruct a Veterinary Surgeon to treat exhibit and the costs paid by the Exhibitor to the Society. The Society shall not be in any way liable to an Exhibitor for any damage to or injury to such Exhibit.

Where, in the opinion of the Society, an Exhibit, being an animal, should be destroyed or removed from the Showgrounds, the Society's Veterinary Surgeon or the GSS may destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds, or both. Alternatively, the GSS may require the Exhibitor to destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds, or both. Any costs incurred by the Society pursuant to this By-Law must be reimbursed by the Exhibitor.

The Society shall not be responsible for any loss or damage caused (inter alia) through disease or infection howsoever arising.

BIOSECURITY QUEENSLAND REGULATIONS

All Queenslanders have a 'general biosecurity obligation' (GBO) under Queensland's Biosecurity Act 2014 (PDF, 1.5MB). Not complying with the GBO is an offence.

This means that everyone is responsible for managing biosecurity risks that are:

- Under their control and
- That they know about or should be expected to know about.

Under the GBO, individuals and organisations whose activities pose a biosecurity risk must:

- Take all reasonable and practical steps to prevent or minimise each biosecurity risk
- Minimise the likelihood of causing a 'biosecurity event,' and limit the consequences if such an event is caused the following conditions will apply to stock and Vehicles moving on to the Gatton Showgrounds

NLIS SCANNING WILL COMMENCE ON SATURDAY MORNING PRIOR TO JUDGING. ENSURE ALL FORMS ARE COMPLETED AND AVAILABLE FOR THE NLIS OPERATOR.

- 1. Age of Cattle shall be as at to 1^{st} July 2025.
- 2. All animals will be registered in a Herd Book of the respective Breed Society.
- 3. Registration certificate(s) must be made available to Stewards if requested.
- 4. All exhibitors MUST have Public Liability Insurance and to have same endorsed for travelling to Gatton Show.

7. All exhibitors Must adhere to and follow all Biosecurity protocols and requirements; this includes the proper documentation for the perspective needs.

8. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure the leaders of their stock in judging rings are capable of exercising control over the animals in their care, to ensure public safety and safety of other exhibitors.

- 9. Any Animal shown as an individual Exhibit may <u>not</u> be shown with its Dam.
- 10. In Cow classes, calves exhibited at foot **MUST** be **UNDER** 8 Months of Age.
- 11. All cattle housed on the grounds overnight **MUST** have a neck strap on.
- 12. All Animals over 6 Months must have Nose Grip or Ring. Bulls 1 year and over must have NOSE RING.
- 13. All Exhibits **MUST** always be haltered.

14. All Stock **MUST** be **FREE** from Ticks. Tick infested cattle will not be allowed to compete and must be removed from the Showgrounds.

15. ALL EXIBITORS MUST SUPPLY THEIR OWN WATER TROUGH/BUCKET, NO SHARING WATER SOURCE BETWEEN EXIBITORS. Water taps are provided inside and outside of shed for filling individual water sources.

16. All electronic appliances and

leads are to be tested and tagged to meet current date requirements.

Bedding and stall allocation.

- Self-allocations are to be based on as Below.
- Bedding is provided in the form of wood shavings and cost covered additionally with Entry fee per head. Please notify the chief steward if you wish to supply your own bedding otherwise the cost of bedding will be charged.
- Exhibitors who have purchased bedding will have first preferences for being on the show ring side of the shed (two lane ways closest to show ring)
- Exhibitors who supply their own bedding will have a choice of space left over in the shed (lane way furthest from show ring)
- The Beef Cattle Chief Steward reserves the right to reallocate space to any exhibitor upon the arrival of their exhibits on the grounds if the numbers indicated by them do not arrive. Accommodation on grounds for exhibitors will only be available from the Morning of Friday 18th of July 2025.
- Gate 5 located at the corner of Yates St and Woodlands Rd and is the only entrance available and will be open continuously until 9pm on Friday 18th of July 2025 and again on Saturday 19th of July 2025 from 5am

ARRIVAL OF STOCK/FEED AND EQUIPMENT

No cattle allowed on grounds Prior to Friday the 18th of July 2025. Thursday night 17th of July for stall preparation only to be arranged with the Chief steward prior.

HOUSE KEEPING

- The walk ways are to be kept clear of all show gear, boxes and clutter. Please allow your self-room to store items out of the walk way in stall allocations and hay racks.
- Prior to leaving the Show Grounds, Exhibitors are asked to rake back bedding ONE METER away from wall, to aid towards clean up.
- No power leads are to be on the ground in walk ways or near wet areas.

DOGS

Exhibitors are advised that only dogs entered in the competitive canine section/s will be permitted on the show grounds other than personal assistance dogs.
